BASIC ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Laredo College provides a range of financial aid programs to help eligible students cover the costs of their education. To qualify for most aid, students must meet the following requirements:

- 1. Financial Need: Most programs require proof of financial need.
- Citizenship Status: Applicants must be U.S. citizens or eligible noncitizens.
- Social Security Number: A valid Social Security number is required (except for citizens of specific Pacific island nations).
- 4. **Selective Service Registration**: Male students must register with Selective Service between the ages of 18 and 25.
- Enrollment in a Program: Students must be enrolled or accepted into an eligible degree or certificate program.
- Minimum Enrollment: At least half-time enrollment is required for Direct Loan eligibility.
- Academic Progress: Students must maintain satisfactory academic progress.
- 8. Certification Statement: Applicants must certify that they:
 - · Are not in default on federal student loans.
 - Do not owe refunds on federal grants.
 - · Will use aid for educational purposes only.
- 9. **Educational Qualifications**: Must show readiness for college through a high school diploma, GED, or equivalent. Other pathways include homeschooling or enrolling in certain eligible career programs.

Additional Notes

- Some circumstances, such as non-U.S. citizenship, criminal convictions, or intellectual disabilities, may require additional steps to determine eligibility.
- Laredo College also offers the Palomino Pledge, a program to cover remaining tuition and fees not met by financial aid for qualifying degree-seeking students. No separate application is required, but eligibility criteria and deadlines must be met.
